<b>Level Of Qualification</b>	This is a First Cycle (Bachelor's Degree) Program
<b>Qualification Awarded</b>	The students who successfully complete the program are awarded the degree of Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Bachelor Program in Security Sciences and Public Management fields.
<b>Mode Of Study</b>	Full-Time
<b>Specific Admission Requirements</b>	Those who want to enroll in JSGA undergraduate degree programs must get the sufficient score required by JSGA from the exam administered by the Student Selection and Placement Center (OSYM) and should not have an existing enrollment in another higher education program. The students who qualify to enroll in undergraduate degree programs whose medium of instruction is 30% English have to take Language Preparation Class Exception Exam. "Directive on the education and training of Language Preparation Class" and other regulations apply to Language Preparation Class Exception Exam and Preparatory English Courses.
<b>Specific Arrangements For Recognition Of Prior Learning</b>	The credits of the students that will be obtained within the Erasmus+ Program and the other mobility activities as well as the credits that are brought together from the other universities will be fully recognised and the students will receive any kind of help throughout the recognition process.

<p><b>Qualification Requirements And Regulations</b></p>	<p>The undergraduate students in this program must be successful in all of the courses with a minimum achievement grade of DC, must have completed at least 240 ECTS credits and have scored a minimum CGPA of 2.00/4.00. At the same time, the students must complete their compulsory internship within the designated period of time and within the scope of necessary qualifications.</p>

**(1)** DV indicates that this course is longer than one term and the student will go on the next term.

**(2)** EK indicates that the student has not yet fulfilled the responsibilities of that course such as homework, projects etc. If the responsibilities are not accomplished the EK will turn into FF and the student will fail for that course.

**(3)** KL (Removed) indicates that the course has been removed from the catalogue and the students are no longer responsible from that course.

**(4)** SD (Optional) indicates that this course is optional and it will not be included in the students' latter GPA.

**(5)** DC indicates that the student has been provisionally successful in a course will fail if s/he cannot accomplish in the compensation exams.

**(6)** FF-DD (Fail) indicates that the student has been unsuccessful/unsatisfactory in a course and not included in his GPA.

**(7)** DZ (Leave of Absence) indicates that the student has been unable to complete the requirements of a course because of sickness or some other valid reason pursuant to the relevant provision of this Regulation and is not included in GPA until it is transformed into an achievement grade. If this course is not completed the following semester in which the course is available, DZ automatically turns into an FF.

	<p>(8) MU (Exemption) indicates that the student have exemption for the previous program courses which are deemed equivalent to the courses offered in their new undergraduate program. Decision for the course exemption is made by the relevant faculty committee. The courses that student is exempt from are processed as a non-credit exemption and they are not included in the student's GPA.</p> <p>(9) YZ-YT (Qualified/Unqualified) is used to describe the success level of the students for the courses which are not credited in the system such as shooting, martial arts, student clubs etc.</p>
<b>Graduation Requirements</b>	To be able to qualify for graduation, students must complete all the courses in the instructional plan, assignments, field work, applied projects, assignments, workshops, seminars, attendance, laboratory work and other related activities with a minimum CGPA of 2.00.
